DESCRIPTION OF BILLS

HB2500	Allows person obtaining treatment for abused animal to recover cost from abuser.
HB2829	Establishes wildlife conservation fund in Department of Fish and Wildlife.
HB2834	Requires state plan to preserve corridors and provide highway crossings for wildlife.
HB3035	Increases penalties for poaching of wildlife.
SB0580	Prohibits the use of cyanide devices ("M44s") to kill wildlife.
SB0638	Requires dogs and cats used in research to be available for adoption after research.
SB0723	Would have banned coyote-killing contests. (Passed in Senate; no vote in House.)
SB1019	Requires eggs produced or sold in Oregon to come from cage-free hens beginning 2024.
